"Koinonia After Church" 2019-20 Fellowship Dinners

Our purpose: To encourage true fellowship (Koinonia) in Christ among the saints of the church. "Koinonia" is Christian fellowship or communion, with God, or more commonly, with fellow Christians.

Again, keeping this year's fellowship dinners simple, we will be doing "Koinonia after Church" 4 times a year. The menu for each dinner this year will be up to the team....BBQ, Italian, Roast Beef, Ham, Soup, Taco Bar, Chili, Baked Potato Bar... are a few suggestions.

Each **team** provides: The main dish and main side. **Congregation** provides: Salads, breads and desserts. The teams are large enough that responsibilities can be divided up and team members will be able help with the following: <u>set up</u>, make main dish, provide side dishes, serve, tear down, clean up, etc. <u>Many hands make light work!</u> This set up, start to finish, takes only 30 minutes. Each team member should attend the 9:30 service if the established plan is followed. There is no need to miss church and the fellowship of the saints during worship.

Mark your calendar now, and if you can't make it when you're scheduled, you must switch with someone on a different date. Do not call the office or team leader to switch or cancel. Being responsible & reliable team members is key to these events working smoothly. It's important for all team members to participate and not disregard each other (Gal. 6:5 for each one should carry his own load).

In addition to these 4 times of scheduled church wide Koinonia, we encourage you to invite each other into your homes or out to eat on Sundays, Fridays or any time for fellowship. Another time of fellowshipping and working side by side is the Annual Chicken BBQ missions fundraiser providing us all with an opportunity to pitch in and serve. This affords us many times to break bread and fellowship and serve one another. Let's make the most of these opportunities!!

Sit with people with which you are not acquainted (not segregating yourselves, but sitting among your brothers and sisters that are not on your team).

The Responsibilities

- 1. Team Leader contacts highlighted members of their team to implement the established plan.
- 2. Highlighted members contact those under them to pass on the established plan.

3. Be available & willing to help.

4. Provide food, set up, tear down and clean up.

5. Attend 9:30 am service to encourage others in the fellowship as commanded in the Bible.

The Established Plan

The Food

- 1. Half of your team (18 +) makes main dish (9 large crockpots). Plan on 110 people. (Ex. Ham)
- 2. The other half who is not making a main dish, will make a crockpot (9 large crockpots) of the main side dish. (EX. Baked beans)
- Congregation always brings salads, breads and desserts.

The "Morning of" Set Up

1. This 30 minute set up is all that is required so all the team can make it to church by 9:30

2. Team arrives by 8:30 am with their food and ready to set up

- 3. Paper & plastic-ware are located to the right (or North toward church) of the concession counter.
- 4. Some set up tables and chairs

5. Some set up tall serving tables

6. Some organize the food on the serving tables

- All Main Dishes are kept hot on <u>Skates</u> counter for two lines to come thru (**no serving**/self serve)
- All main side dishes, salads, breads on tall serving tables
- Drinks on Concessions counter top
- Desserts on kitchen counter top
- Table service (plates, Bowls, spoons, forks, knoves & napkins) on <u>Skates counter & Tall</u> serving

Salt and Pepper placed on each table

Pitchers of water and cups placed on each table

The Meal

- 1. Only 3 refill tables during the meal (No servers please as this slows the lines down)
- 2. All sit among your brothers and sisters that are not on your team
- 3. Many clean up
- 4. Many tear down

5. Tearing down begins at 2:15 and not before

6. Have an announcer to ask people to clean up after themselves

Again, the teams are large enough to easily divide responsibilities.

Enjoy your time working together and getting to know each other better as you show hospitality to the saints and to help them experience true "koinonia" (fellowship).
